## **Library Renovation**

Due to the expected addition of a third grade 5 class, we will need an additional classroom for next year. To create the necessary space, a dividing wall will soon be built in the library. The current English Resource room (Room 9) will become the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade 5 classroom. We are in discussions to determine how best to allocate the remaining spaces.

### **Anti-Bullying Presentations**

We are fortunate to be a part of the No Time for This Anti-Bullying Society's 2021 virtual tour. Students will view a presentation, followed by a question and answer session on Tuesday March 23.

### **Early Literacy Support/Francisation**

The Ministry has provided a special budget to support the academic needs of students in the context of the pandemic. As a school, we decided to focus on early literacy intervention. Up to four students in each grade 1-3 class will be receiving support from Marcelle Auger, a retired teacher/consultant. Students entitled to francisation (new to the province within the last two years) are also working with her.

### **Drinking Water**

Testing was done on the drinking water in all schools in the province over the past year, focusing on the possible presence of lead in the water.

The following are the types of water consumption points that **<u>have</u>** been tested:

- Drinking fountains
- Classroom sinks (kindergarten and pre-K only)
- Staff room sink or other equivalent for water consumption/food preparation
- Commercial kitchen sink or other equivalent for food preparation

Sinks in classrooms (other than kindergarten classes) <u>have not</u> been tested, so signs have been put up in those classrooms to indicate that the water should only be used for hand-washing.

It is therefore recommended that staff and students only use hallway drinking fountains to refill water bottles. The actual drinking spouts on the fountains will not be available during the pandemic.

## **Procedural Masks for all Students**

All students in grades 1-6 are now <u>obliged</u> to wear a procedural mask inside the building at all times during the school day and on the school bus. Students have adapted very well to the new requirement.
